ISAIAH 52:13-53:12

THE SUFFERING SERVANT

### **BACKGROUND**

This passage is the last of four 'servant songs' in the Book of Isaiah (42:1-4; 49:1-6; 50:4-7). Who is the 'Suffering Servant' of **Isaiah 52:13-53:12**? This is the same question asked by the Ethiopian Eunuch to Phillip in **Acts 8:32-35**. Phillip's response at that time is sufficient for us today.

Two key elements to this discussion are: predictive prophecy and efficacious suffering. The suffering of the servant in Isaiah was substitutionary suffering. He suffered not for himself, but for others. This eliminates other possible candidates as the 'Suffering Servant'.

Isaiah's clear, prophetic description gives us even greater appreciation for all that Jesus accomplished for us, and His sacrifice in providing it.
